**Abductions of Japanese Citizens
by North Korea
and
Issue of Missing Japanese
Probably Related to North Korea**

Our organization "The Investigation Commission on Missing Japanese Probably Related to North Korea (COMJAN)" is a Japanese Private Organization established January 2003, in order to conduct research on a number of cases of disappearance which are "probably related" to North Korea.

We strongly believe abductions of Japanese citizens by North Korea are absolutely against the Article 12-2,12-4 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights.

We, hereby, submit our NGO report "Abductions of Japanese Citizens by North Korea And Issue of Missing Japanese Probably Related to North Korea"

1. Summary

On September 17,2002, Kim Jong Il, the then Supreme Leader of North Korea admitted that North Korean Agents had abducted 13 Japanese nationals.

Consequently, in the following month, five of them returned to Japan.

As a matter of fact, North Korea announced that "Amongst those 13 Japanese, 5 of them are "alive" and 8 of them had already died." And they "released" those 5 abductees to "return" to Japan. But regarding those 8 abductees that North Korea announced "already died", there was absolutely no clear evidence of their death. In particular, it has been confirmed that several of them are certainly alive in North Korea after "the date of death" that North Korea referred in their report.

The Government of Japan has been officially identified 17 Japanese citizens (in 12 cases) as "abductees by North Korea" (as of September 2022)

But those cases are just only "the tip of the huge

iceberg".

We strongly believe that there must be larger number of Japanese citizens abducted by North Korea and still being captured in North Korea. This situation has been brought to light by a lot of pieces of physical evidence as well as testimonies.

Naturally, the Government of Japan should make best efforts to rescue all the abducted Japanese citizens.

In this regard, we do strongly request that the Government of Japan should immediately disclose/release all the information it holds, especially related to "Missing Japanese citizens with whom the possibility of the abduction by North Korea can not be ruled out".

(note) We have obtained approvals to release the names of "Missing Japanese Probably Related to North Korea" from their family members.

2. Issue of Missing Japanese Probably Related to North Korea

2-1 What is "Issue of Missing Japanese Probably Related to North Korea"?

On September 17, 2002, the then Japanese Prime Minister Junichiro Koizumi visited Pyongyang to have the very first leaders' meeting with North Korea (DPRK), then North Korea's Supreme Leader Kim Jong Il admitted to Prime Minister Koizumi that North Korean Agents had abducted 13 Japanese nationals (seven women and six men). As a result, on October 15, five of Japanese abductees

returned to Japan.

(note)

As mentioned earlier, North Korea announced that "Amongst those 13 Japanese, 5 of them are "alive" and 8 of them had already died." And they "released" those 5 abductees to "return" to Japan.

But regarding those 8 abductees that North Korea announced "already died", there was absolutely no clear evidence of their death. In particular, it has been confirmed that several of them are certainly alive in North Korea after "the date of death" that North Korea referred in their report.

Since Ms. Hitomi Soga, one of the five abductees who returned to Japan, had not been recognized as an abductee by the government of Japan before that time, a large number of inquiries about missing family members from all over the country were made. The National Association for the Rescue of Japanese Kidnapped by North Korea (NARKN) as well as a lot of local police stations received a flood of those inquiries saying "We wonder our missing family member(s) could possibly be kidnapped by North Korean agents."

Under these circumstances, "The Investigation Commission on Missing Japanese Probably Related to North Korea" (hereafter "COMJAN") was established on January 10, 2003, in order to conduct research on a large number of disappearance which could possibly be related to North Korea.

Concurrently, we designated a new term "specific missing persons" who are defined as "missing Japanese citizens with whom the possibility of the abduction by North Korea can not be ruled out".

As of September 2022, COMJAN has a list of about 470 "specific missing persons", and the National Police Agency also has its own list of approximately 900 missing persons who have the possibility of being abducted by North Korea. Apart from those missing persons whose names are on the lists edited by COMJAN or the National Police Agency, we assume there could be many cases of disappearances that have not been inquired because of absence of family members/relatives nearby, or because those family members would never imagine the possibility of abduction at all, but actually those disappearances were caused by abductions by North Korea.

In fact, most of the family members of the abductees who are now officially identified by the Government of Japan had not imagined that they were abducted by North Korea.

On the COMJAN's list, there are some cases of disappearances that took place before or after 1950. Most of those cases were, at that time, concluded as suicides or running away from home by the police, and the investigations were abandoned or even were given up actually just after those disappearances. Therefore, we have been suffering from an absolute lack of necessary information.

COMJAN has been actively conducting research on those "specific missing persons" mainly focusing on the relations to abduction, by reconsidering various information that were gathered at the time of those disappearances. And consequently, we found that there are many cases in which those missing persons have common factors such as occupations, academic backgrounds, or situations of disappearances etc. although they have no relations with each other.

In addition to the operation for gathering necessary information in Japan, COMJAN has been collecting various information including eyewitness information in North Korea, by utilizing every possible measures such as conducting interviews with defectors or exiles from North Korea.

As a consequence we have announced 77 "missing persons with high probability of being abducted by North Korea" (as of September 2022).

And besides, Ms. Kyoko Matsumoto, who were originally on the COMJAN'S list of "specific missing persons", has been officially identified by the Government of Japan since November 20, 2006, as a Japanese citizen abducted by North Korea.

In the case of Kiyomi KO and Tsuyoshi KO (They are a sister and a brother.), they have not been officially identified by the Government of Japan, simply because they do not have the nationality of Japan, they have been recognized as abductees by the police. So, they have been treated as "de facto" officially identified abductees.

Having been actively conducting research such as collecting necessary information inside and outside of Japan, COMJAN has been also sending everyday voice messages in order to inform about the strong will that we Japanese nationals are fully committed to rescue our compatriots who were abducted by North Korea and still being captured there, through our own radio broadcasting program namely "SHIOKAZE" (that means "sea breeze" in Japanese).

We have been also conducting "Balloon Project" in collaboration with an association of defectors from North Korea in ROK. This project is to

scatter a huge number of fliers conveyed with big balloons from ROK to North Korean territory in order to input various information to those abducted citizens being captured in North Korea and even North Korean citizens.

(Unfortunately, this operation has been currently suspended due to the influence of the policy of the former Administration of ROK.)

Rescue of Japanese citizens abducted by North Korea is not merely the matter of the Government of Japan, but the matter of the international community. Under the North Korea's autocratic regime there have been also the most serious human rights issue such as "concentration camps" as well as serious threatening issue of nuclear weapons and missiles, drugs, and counterfeit bills.

Definitely, those problems should not be overlooked by the rest of the world.

The rescue of those abducted citizens is apparently related to the resolution of those serious problems with North Korea.

Therefore, COMJAN is fully committed to continue to make our efforts in allying with related organizations/individuals in both public and private sector.

2-2 Examples of Cases of "Missing Japanese Probably Related to North Korea"

Here are summaries of 23 cases "Missing Japanese Probably Related to North Korea"

(1) Kaoru KIMURA (Ms.) (then 21)

Born on 27 August 1938. She disappeared on 27 February 1960 after she left the school dormitory. She was a nurse school student at that time. There is a witness testimony on her presence in the DPRK by a Thai woman who went to North Korea in 1982 and then came back to Thailand. In addition, Mr. Kenji Fujimoto, a chef formerly working for Kim Jong Il witnessed her in mid-December 1982 at a restaurant in Pyongyang where he was working as a chef. There are other pieces of uncorroborated information on her presence in the DPRK.

(2) Teruko KASE (Ms.) (then 17)

Born on 4 May 1944. She was a homemaker. She disappeared in April 1962 after she left a beauty salon. A defector from the DPRK residing in South Korea provided a photo of a woman for the Japanese media in September 2004. The specialist who did the analysis of the photo said, "It is appropriate to judge that the woman in the photo is anthropologically and anatomically the same person as Teruko Kase."

(3) Nobuo HIDAKA (Mr.) (then 22)

Born on 27 November 1944. He was working for a printing company. Around September 1967, he disappeared on his way from Tokyo to Osaka after one of his colleagues saw him off. In August 2006, a journalist informed COMJAN that he was with a DPRK defector in South Korean hospital who told him that the defector saw someone who resembled Nobuo Hidaka in Pyongyang. The information from the defector highly corroborated the existing information on Nobuo Hidaka.

(4) Shin'ichi MIZUSHIMA (Mr.) (then 18)

Born on 24 April 1949. He disappeared on 9 February 1968 after he left home. He was a high school student at that time. As he was to graduate from high school in the following month and had

already found an employment after graduation, there is no reason for him to disappear. The circumstances surrounding his disappearance are very much similar to those of Hiroshi Saito and Yutaka Imai as described below. Quite a few high school students and young people disappeared around 1968.

(5) Hiroshi SAITO (Mr.) (then 18)

Born on 17 September 1950. He disappeared on the night of 1 December 1968 while he was on his way from home to the house of his friend. He was already securing employment after graduation from high school and there is no reason for him to disappear. According to Kim Guksok, a North Korean defector, he learned the Japanese language from a person who is considered to be Hiroshi Saito while the defector was studying at Madonghee Military University for two years from July 1990. There are other sources of information indicating that Hiroshi Saito was seen in North Korea and that he is alive there.

(6) Yutaka IMAI (Mr.) (then 18)

Born on 20 December 1950. He disappeared on the night of 2 March 1969 after he left home to purchase a button of his school uniform to wear at the graduation ceremony on the following day. He was to start working for a railway company in Tokyo after graduation and to give a speech as the representative of the graduates at the graduation ceremony.

(7) Masayuki OHYASHIKI (Mr.) (then 16)

Born on 5 December 1952. He disappeared on 28 July 1969 while camping at the beach in Numazu, Shizuoka. He was a high school student at that time. Kwon Hyok, a North Korean defector testified that he witnessed Masayuki Ohyashiki in North Korea.

(8) Kumiko KATO (Ms.) (then 22)

Born on 1 January 1948. She disappeared in Kitakyushu, Fukuoka, on 8 August 1970 on her way to her workplace. She was an employee. An Myongjin, a former North Korean agent, witnessed a person who is considered to be Kumiko Kato many times between 1988 and 1990 at Kim Jong Il Political and Military University, an agent education institution located in the suburb of Pyongyang.

(9) Hajime SONODA (Mr.) (then 53)

(10) Toshiko SONODA (Mrs.) (then 42)

Hajime Sonoda was born on 25 February 1918 and Toshiko Sonoda was born on 7 September 1929. They got married in 1948 and were working as employees for the poultry company. They disappeared on 30 December 1971 on their way by car from home to Miyazaki Airport. Their car is not found. There are pieces of information by North Korean defectors that Toshiko was seen in North Korea.

(11) Takako IKUSHIMA (Ms.) (then 31)

Born on 14 June 1941. She was an employee in a city hall. She disappeared on 1 November 1972 after she left her home in Tokyo. O Gilnam, a South Korean professor saw and spoke to a person who appeared to be Takako Ikushima in Pyongyang in 1986. O Gilnam was lured from West Germany to North Korea with his family and then later defected from North Korea. O Gilnam also witnessed a person who appeared to be Toru Ishioka, an abductee identified by the Japanese government, in Pyongyang.

(12) Noriko FURUKAWA (Ms.) (then 18)

Born on 1 January 1955. She disappeared on 7 July 1973 after she left home in Ichihara, Chiba. She was an employee. An Myongjin witnessed her in May 1990 at 915 Hospital (a hospital for agents in the suburb of Pyongyang).

(13) Takashi OHSAWA (Mr.) (then 27)

Born on 21 August 1946. He disappeared on his way home in Sado Island, Niigata on 24 February 1974. COMJAN found by its own researches that he was targeted and abducted as he was an engineer on irrigation, drainage & rural engineering and that he was probably abducted by North Korea from the coast near Shukunegi, the place close to the southeast end of the island.

(14) Kiyomi KO (Ms.) (then 6)

(15) Tsuyoshi KO (Mr.) (then 2 or 3)

Kiyomi Ko was born on 10 April 1967 and Tsuyoshi Ko was born on 29 June 1970. They were abducted before attaining the age for school education. Their mother is Hideko Watanabe. She got married to Ko Daegi, a Korean, without knowing that he was a North Korean agent. Ko Daegi is their father. As Ko Daegi suddenly disappeared after he was told to come back to the North Korea, Hideko Watanabe, together with her two children, looked for Ko Daegi and visited his workplace, which was a shell corporation of the North Korean agency. There, other North Korean agents confined them as they were afraid that their activities as North Korean agents may be revealed. Kiyomi Ko and Tsuyoshi Ko are considered to have been abducted to North Korea around June 1973 from the coast of Obama, Fukui. Some consider that their mother have been killed. However, her whereabouts are unknown to this day. The National Police Agency of Japan officially announced on 12 April 2007 that they were abducted by North Korea.

(They are not included in the list of 17 abductees officially recognized by the Government of Japan because they have the Korean nationality due to the fact that their father is Korean whereas only those with the Japanese nationality are officially recognized as abductees by the Government of Japan. For the purpose of the communications here,

they are treated as the Japanese nationals as their mother is Japanese.

(16) Yoshihiko HAGIMOTO (Mr.) (then 35)

Born on 15 January 1940. He was an employee of a steel company. He disappeared on the night of 4 April 1975, when he headed to his company by bike. Kim Donghyok, a North Korean defector who fled to South Korea, witnessed in 1976 a person who appeared to be Yoshihiko Hagimoto.

(17) Susumu FUJITA (Mr.) (then 19)

Born on 16 June 1956. He disappeared on 7 February 1976 after he left home. He was a university student at the time of disappearance. In June 2004, the person who provided a photo of a woman considered to be Teruko Kase also provided two photos of a man. The specialist who did the analysis of the photos said, "It is appropriate to judge that the man in the photos is most likely the same person as Susumu Fujita from the viewpoint of legal anthropology. Around the same time, the Japanese police did the similar appraisal and reached the same conclusion.

(18) Tomiko KUNIHICO (Ms.) (then 24)

Born on 9 February 1952. She disappeared on 2 August 1976 in Ube, Yamaguchi after she left home. She was a nurse. There is a witness testimony that she was seen in the DPRK.

(19) Akira ARAKI (Mr.) (then 29)

Born on 16 October 1947. He disappeared on 21 May 1977 after he left home in Kawaguchi, Saitama. He was in casual clothes at the time of disappearance. He was a banker.

(20) Tatsumitsu KANEDA (Mr.) (then 26)

Born on 12 December 1952. He disappeared around 1979 in or around Tokyo. He was working for a Chinese restaurant, the same restaurant where Minoru Tanaka, an abductee who was recognized by

the Japanese government, worked. The head of this restaurant is a member of North Korean secret agency "Nakdong-gang." Mr. Tanaka was lured to Vienna, Austria by deception and then abducted to the DPRK. Tatsumitsu Kaneda disappeared in the following year.

(21) Miho YAMAMOTO (Ms.) (then 20)

Born on 3 March 1964. She disappeared on 4 June 1984 in Kofu, Yamanashi after she left home. Later, her bag was found at the coast in Kashiwazaki, Niigata. She was preparing for an entrance examination of universities. Kwon Hyok testified that Miho Yamamoto was seen in North Korea.

(22) Miwa AKITA (Ms.) (then 21)

Born on 25 January 1964. She disappeared on 4 December 1985 in Kobe, Hyogo after she left her university. She was a university student. Her bag and shoes were found at the coast in Hyogo Prefecture on the following day of disappearance just as in the case of Miho Yamamoto. Many young women disappeared throughout Japan around 1985. Abductions for the purpose of marriage to abducted men are suspected.

(23) Etsuko SASAKI (Ms.) (then 27)

Born on 6 December 1963. She disappeared on 22 April 1991 after she left home in Urawa, Saitama. Kwon Hyok testified her presence in North Korea.

(Reference)

Abductees officially identified by the Government of Japan

(1) Yutaka KUME (Mr.) (then 52)

Born on 17 February 1925. He was a guardman. He was abducted on 19 September 1977 on the coast of Ushitsu in Ishikawa Prefecture.

(2) Kyoko MATSUMOTO (Ms.) (then 29)

Born on 7 September 1948. She was a factory worker. She was abducted on 21 October 1977 on her way to knitting class near her home in Yonago city, Tottori Prefecture.

(note) Ms. Matsumoto was originally just on the COMJAN'S list of "Specific Missing People". The Government of Japan, later on, officially recognized her as a Japanese citizen abducted by North Korea on November 20, 2006.

(3) Megumi YOKOTA (Ms.) (then 13)

Born on 5 October 1964. She was a junior high school student. She was abducted on 15 November 1977 on her way home from school in Niigata City, Niigata Prefecture.

(4) Minoru TANAKA (Mr.) (then 28)

Born on 28 July 1949. He was a staff of a Chinese restaurant. He was abducted around June 1978, after departing from Japan for Europe.

(5) Yaeko TAGUCHI (Ms.) (then 22)

Born on 10 August 1955. She was a staff of a restaurant. She was abducted around June 1978, from Toshima-ku, Tokyo.

(6) Yasushi CHIMURA (Mr.) (then 23)

(7) Fukie HAMAMOTO (Ms.) (then 22)

Mr. Chimura was born on 4 June 1955 and Ms. Hamamoto was born on 8 June 1955. Mr. Chimura was working for a company and Ms. Hanamoto was working for a shop. They were abducted on 7 July 1978 in Obama City, Fukui Prefecture. They returned to Japan on 15 October 2002.

(8) Kaoru HASUIKE (Mr.) (then 20)

(9) Yukiko OKUDO (Ms.) (then 22)

Mr. Hasuike was born on 29 September 1957 and Ms. Okudo was born on 15 April 1956. Mr. Hasuike was a university student and Ms. Okudo was working for a company. They were abducted on 31 July 1978 in Kashiwazaki City, Niigata Prefecture. They returned to Japan on 15 October 2002.

(10) Shuichi ICHIKAWA (Mr.) (then 23)

(11) Rumiko MASUMOTO (Ms.) (then 24)

Mr. Ichikawa was born on 20 October 1954 and Ms. Masumoto was born on 1 November 1953. Mr. Ichikawa was working for a company. Ms. Masumoto was also working for a company. They were abducted on 12 August 1978 on the coast of Fukiage, Kagoshima Prefecture.

(12) Miyoshi SOGA (Ms.) (then 46)

(13) Hitomi SOGA (Ms.) (then 19)

Ms. Miyoshi Soga was born on 28 December 1931. Ms. Hitomi Soga was born on 17 May 1959. Ms. Miyoshi Soga was a homemaker and Ms. Hitomi Soga was a nursery school student. They were abducted on 12 August 1978 in Mano Town, Niigata Prefecture. Ms. Hitomi Soga returned to Japan on 15 October 2002.

(14) Toru ISHIOKA (Mr.) (then 22)

(15) Kaoru MATSUKI (Mr.) (then 26)

Mr. Ishioka was born on 29 June 1957 and Mr. Matsuki was born on 13 June 1953. Mr. Ishioka graduated from a university and travelling. Mr. Matsuki was studying abroad. They were abducted around May 1980 in Europe.

(16) Tadaaki HARA (Mr.) (then 43)

Born on 2 August 1937. He was a staff of a Chinese restaurant. He was abducted in 1980 on the coast of Aoshima beach, Miyazaki Prefecture.

(17) Keiko ARIMOTO (Ms.) (then 23)

Born on 12 January 1960. She was studying abroad and abducted around July 1983 in Europe.

2-3 Measures against "Issue of Missing Japanese Probably Related to North Korea" taken by the Government of Japan

The Government of Japan has officially identified 17 Japanese citizens (in 12 cases) as "abductees by North Korea" (as of September 2022)

But those cases are just only "the tip of the huge iceberg".

We strongly believe that there is no doubt the whole picture of actual state of abductions of Japanese citizens committed by North Korea has been carefully "concealed" due to various reasons. This

situation has been brought to light by a lot of pieces of physical evidence as well as testimonies.

In order to deal with this situation, the Government of Japan currently announces "The government of Japan has been making a concerted effort to urge North Korea to return all the abductees, regardless of whether they are officially identified as such, back to Japan immediately."

3. Conclusion and Recommendation

Therefore we strongly request the CCPR to issue recommendations as follows to the Government of Japan.

- 1) The Government of Japan should immediately disclose/release all the related information about missing Japanese citizens whose names are referred in this report.
- 2) The Government of Japan should immediately

disclose/release the total approximate number of abducted Japanese citizens by North Korea (whom the Government of Japan actually "recognize" as abductions by North Korea.) apart from the 17 abductees officially identified by the Government of Japan.

- 3) The Government of Japan should immediately disclose/release all the information about abducted citizens who do not have the nationality of Japan (including "foreign" citizens who were abducted in Japan.)
