- 1. Whether the Government collected data and information on women living in poverty, disaggregated by age and according to urban and rural areas;
- 2. Whether they developed targeted policies and support services;
- 3. Whether the Government defined about direct and indirect discrimination and why Government excluded the 30 percent minimum quota of women candidates for the Parliament election that was adopted in 2005?
- 4. Whether the Government reviewed and reformed all gender discriminatory laws, in consultation with professional and women's groups. If so how many and how?
- 5. Whether Mongolia Government specifically developed gender-sensitization and legal literacy programs for its large youth population and if yes when and how many times and what are the outcomes?
- 6. What particularly have done to reflect women's participation in legislative, national and local government bodies and in decision-making posts in administration?
- 7. Did Mongolia Government enact the domestic violence law, including marital rape? and does it enforces and develops a holistic range of initiatives to respond to violence against women in the light of general recommendation 19 on violence against women and the Declaration on the Elimination of Violence against Women.
- 8. Did Government establish strong and effective national machinery that the Convention and the Beijing Platform for Action can be integrated into development plans.
- 9. Did Mongolian Government concerns that gender to be integrated into the work of the human rights commission and that women be appointed as members of this body?
- 10. What have done to combat prostitution and trafficking in women? Did the Government take steps to prosecute buyers and persons engaged in organizing prostitution and to adopt effective measures to combat trafficking in women?
- 11. What was done to develop laws, policies and educational programmes that support and promote the idea of shared parental responsibility and prevent discrimination against women because of family responsibilities?
- 12. What particularly done to disseminate widely concluding comments from the CEDAW Session 24 in 2001 in order to make the people, in particular government administrators and politicians, aware of the steps that have been taken to ensure the de jure and de facto equality of women as well as of further steps that are required in this regard?
- 13. Whether government of Mongolia have taken the appropriate measures to educate members of Parliament and Cabinet on Gender and WHR issues and what have done on same issues at the local level?
