

Introduction

As we proceed to launch the Third National Strategy (2022 – 2026) to combat and prevent trafficking in persons, we recall what was mentioned when assessing the implementation of the second strategy, which is: “The completion of the implementation of the National Strategy (2016-2021) is a starting point for new work through which we build on what has been achieved and develop the elements of work and performance to achieve the best results that would serve Egyptian citizens and society and to prevent individuals from falling prey for any form of exploitation”. Indeed, the Technical Secretariat of the National Coordinating Committee for Combating and Preventing Illegal Migration and Trafficking in Persons (NCCPIM&TIP) was dependent on its accumulative expertise acquired since 2007, as well as the experiences that we went through during the past years, which polished the national capacities that came up with a Third Strategy that befits Egypt’s role and status at the regional and international levels.

The New Strategy adopts the internationally recognized paradigm to combating trafficking in persons that is based on the “4 Ps”: Prevention, Prosecution, Protection, and Partnership, while working to enrich and update the content according to national and international givens. It is worth noting that the release of this Strategy comes at a time where the world is witnessing the emerging threat of the trafficking crime as a result of the repercussions of the COVID-19 pandemic and the Russian-Ukrainian war, particularly the economic impact and the huge social impacts that followed, which left a dangerous mark on the lives of individuals from all segments across the world; in developed, developing, rich or poor countries. Economic and social studies affirm that the decline in income levels and limited job opportunities will contribute to high rates of the trafficking crime and the exploitation of the most vulnerable and needy groups.

Therefore, the Strategy - with its pillars and provisions that tackle the measures related to Prevention, Prosecution and Protection - is an effective tool for the government to protect individuals and achieve community safety. Moreover, it is a tool for raising citizens’ awareness of the dangers facing them by trafficking criminal groups and their attempts to lure them into the clutches of their nets... whether through the traditional or modern forms of trafficking that rely on advanced means of technology and communication. NCCPIM&TIP’s Technical Secretariat was keen that the Strategy includes all the incoming contributions of the Committee’s representative bodies (30 bodies). As a result of this collective effort, the Strategy is comprehensive, and includes all the accurate details related to the subject.

It is worth noting that continuously building on what has been achieved is in the interest of the work and its success, in addition to the expansion of new activities necessitated by national and international developments.

Focusing on the protection pillar is undoubtedly an outcome of what has been achieved in the other pillars, as it is the pillar that needs to be prioritized due to the economic and social circumstances.

The successful implementation of the Strategy’s provisions in this area will have the greatest impact and will not only extend to combating the trafficking crime, but will extend to making progress in respecting internationally recognized human rights’ principles and standards.

The issue of establishing a fund to help Victims of Trafficking (VoTs) is one of the important points that we hope to achieve in the next phase, given that the draft project was finalized by the legal working group in 2018, and we are re-submitting it for discussion with the concerned bodies in preparation for its final approval.

In addition to the foregoing, there are a set of legal procedures, such as ensuring that no penalties are imposed on victims, while providing legal assistance to the most-needy groups, besides developing and disseminating manuals to all parties concerned with providing assistance to victims, as well as providing health and psychological services to them, while providing the necessary training for social workers.

The role of civil society is undoubtedly essential in the success of the (Protection) pillar,

whether through awareness-raising or assistance provision. It goes without saying that the persistent quest to upgrade more shelters and improve the existing ones is a required effort for the success of the protection system.

We should not lose sight of the challenges facing the implementation of the Strategy, particularly:

- The political and economic conditions taking place in the Middle East region, which contribute to the emerging growth of human trafficking criminal groups.
- The emergence of new forms of trafficking, especially those that rely on cybercrime tools.
- The existence of some legal gaps related to domestic workers as a result of the lack of legal provisions that guarantee the protection of this category of irregular workers.
- NCCPIM&TIP's efforts to publish the voluntary domestic workers contract for Egyptian domestic workers, which still faces challenges due to the limited awareness of this category and the inability of employers to abide by a written contract.
- Limited awareness of the trafficking crime among the less privileged in education.
- Difficulty using digital indicators to measure the crime.

Regional and international cooperation continues to reiterate Egypt's leading role in this field, since 2007, and to exchange information and share best practices... It is worth noting that this work has achieved and will achieve numerous benefits for Egypt in terms of training, awareness and capacity-building.

The State's credibility plays a key role in encouraging donor agencies to support the Strategy implementation, and the responsiveness of NCCPIM&TIP's Technical Secretariat to cooperation activities and its success in achieving the desired progress was a catalyst for multiplying all forms of financial and technical support provided to us.

NCCPIM&TIP's Technical Secretariat will seek to expedite the implementation of all the Strategy's pillars and provisions, believing in the social outcome that will accrue to individuals and society as a result, and also the political outcome for the State as a result of what has been achieved in this area, which has become one of the most important areas of crime prevention and human rights.

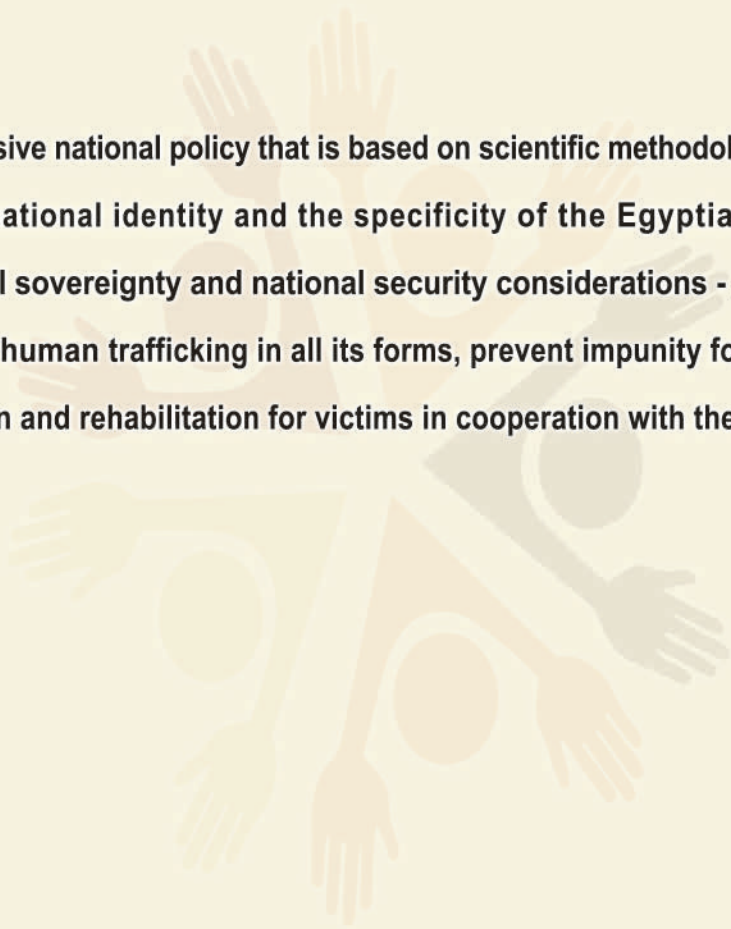
Vision

The Third National Strategy on Combating and Preventing Trafficking in Persons (2022 – 2026)
