Committee against Torture**Decision adopted by the Committee under article 22 of the Convention, concerning communication No. 1130/2022^{*,**}**

<i>State party:</i>	Republic of Serbia
<i>Date of communication:</i>	31 May 2022 (initial submission)
<i>Substantive issues:</i>	Extradition to Türkiye; risk of torture and cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment

1. The communication dated 31 May 2022 was submitted by E.P., a national of Türkiye born in 1974. His application for asylum was denied in the State Party and he was facing deportation to Türkiye. He claimed that by extraditing him to Türkiye, the State Party would violate his rights under article 3 of the Convention. The complainant is represented by counsels.

2. On 2 June 2022, the communication was registered with the request for interim measures granted. The State Party was requested to refrain from removing the complainant to Türkiye, while the communication was pending before the Committee. The interim measures were reiterated on 22 June 2022 and 18 April 2023.

3. On 12 January 2024, the complainant informed that the Appellate Court in Belgrade rejected the deportation to Türkiye, and therefore, requested the Committee to discontinue the communication.

4. In view of the fact that the complainant's deportation was rejected and that he has requested the discontinuance of the communication, the Committee decided at its 83rd session on 14 November 2025, to discontinue consideration of communication 1130/2022.
