


Domestic violence: Number of aggrieved persons per crime and gender, 2011




Domestic violence: aggrieved persons by gender and relationship, 2011



Share of women in selected fields of specialisation, from 1990 onwards









Leaky pipeline in Switzerland, 2010 Carrers in Universities by stage and gender






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






Involvement in informal voluntary work, 2013

Involvement in formal voluntary work, 2013






Main responsibility for housework in couples, 1997 and 2010






Poverty rate according to various characteristics, 2012




These results are based on a distribution of persons; the household variables concern people living in households with these characteristics. Variables on education and the employment market are only collected for persons aged 18 or over. Persons aged under 18 years and those aged 18 to 24, economically inactive and living with their mother and/or father are considered as children. Employed persons are defined here as persons aged 18 or over who were self-employed or employed for more than half of the months in the year before the survey (most frequent activity status). Only subgroups with at least 200 observations in the sample and a confidence interval of a maximum of ±10% are represented.

1 This rate has to be interpreted with caution, since only income poverty is considered here. However, persons aged 65 or over are able more often than other age groups to fall back on assets in addition to income.


