





GRAPH 2: ANALYSIS OF COMPLAINTS DATA FROM 2011 - JUNE 2014 BY THE COMMISSION





GRAPH 3: EDUCATION AND PROMOTION BY THE COMMISSION





GRAPH 5 : NET ENROLMENT FOR 2010 - 2013











GRAPH 7: LABOUR FORCE, EMPLOYMENT AND UNEMPLOYMENT STATISTICS






GRAPH 10: NURSING STATIONS & HEALTH CENTRES IN FIJI




