Notes and sources:

- 1- There are no official statistics regarding the rest of the other components that ISIS attacked, as no government agency has collected data on the victims, and the statistics are limited to those issued by civil society organizations, a number of international donor organizations and some official books published by the media which are monitored by women's organizations.
- 2- There are no clear and announced statistics on the number of children as a result of ISIS, and there are statements that talk about 1,300 children so far, and the government of Iraq and the relevant institutions have reservations about the statement to confirm any number.
- 3- There is great fear of weak implementation of the female Survivors Law, despite the promise made by Iraqi Prime Minister Mustafa Al-Kazemi to harness the efforts of his government to implement the provisions of the law.
- 4- Statistics of the Yazidi Kidnapped Rescue Office.
- 5- These statistics are approved by the United Nations.
- 6- (The Yazidi Sisterhood and Solidarity Association Organization), with AMI and PDO organization had provided psychological, social and legal support to some of the female survivors, and they visited the camps and some of the female survivors.
- 7- Shlomo Documentation Organization statistics for Christians:
 - A- The missing persons whose martyrdom was confirmed reached (38), including (14) women and (24) men, and their names are available to the organization.
 - B- The kidnapped by ISIS, whose fate has not been known until today (34) Christian citizens.
 - C- The number of forcibly displaced families whose status was recorded in the Shlomo Organization to be documented reached (15,076) fifteen thousand and seventy-six families, and the number of members of these families reached (53610) fifty-three thousand six hundred and ten individuals.
 - D- The total number of abductees documented by the organization reached 277 female and male Christian citizens.
 - E- The number of survivors who were rescued reached 185 female and male Christian citizens.
 - F- The number of missing persons is 54 to date.
 - G- The destruction of 79 churches and monasteries in Mosul and the Nineveh Plain, some of which date back to the beginnings of the entry of Christianity into Iraq in the early centuries and have their spiritual, historical, religious and archaeological status.
- 8- About the abducted Turkmen women:

- A Statistics indicate that the organization has kidnapped more than 1,300 Turkmen in Tal Afar alone, most of them were women and children.
- B The fate of 400 Turkmen women is still unknown so far.
- C- Statistics indicate that approximately 42 female and male survivors have escaped from the grip of the terrorist organization, but most of them suffer from neglect and the absence of psychological and social care.
- D- The intelligence service informed the Iraqi Ministry of Foreign Affairs that it had information indicating the presence of Turkmen women in camps: Al-Sad in the city of Raqqa, Abu al-Khashab and Abu Hamam in Deir ez-Zor, al-Hol in al-Hasakah, and Akedeh in Ezaz (Source Shafaq News Agency and MP Arshad al-Salihi).
