REFERENCE: CAT/Follow-up

Excellency,

In my capacity as Rapporteur for Follow-up to Concluding Observations of the Committee against Torture, I have the honor to refer to the follow-up to the examination of the second periodic report of Saudi Arabia, in accordance with the Guidelines for follow-up to concluding observations (CAT/C/55/3).

At the end of the 57th session, the Committee transmitted its concluding observations to your Permanent Mission. The Committee's concluding observations (CAT/C/SAU/CO/2, para. 52 and Corr.1) requested the State party to provide within one year further information on follow-up to the recommendations on: corporal punishment, including the case of Ra'if Badawi; reprisals against human rights defenders and journalists; and, the death penalty (see paras. 11, 13, 20 and 43, respectively)

On 11 December 2018 a reminder was sent to your Permanent Mission, observing that the information sought by the Committee had not yet been provided. In addition, the Committee requested the State party to submit additional information, inter alia, on the measures taken to: ensure that a prompt, effective and impartial investigation is undertaken into allegations that high-level officials were involved in the torture and extrajudicial execution of Jamal Khashoggi; and, to investigate allegations that human rights activists Loujain al-Hathloul, Iman al-Nafjan, Aziza al-Yousef, Samar Badawi, Nassima al-Sada, Mohammad al-Rabe'a and Dr. Ibrahim al-Modeimigh had been arbitrarily detained and tortured or ill-treated in Dhabhan prison.

At its 66th session, held in April-May 2019 in Geneva, the Committee noted that no such information had been received. Therefore, the Government of Saudi Arabia is encouraged to provide as soon as possible any information which may contribute to the Committee's analysis of the progress made regarding the specific issues of concern.
