The delegation of Ghana will be led by Her Excellency Mrs. Nana Oye Lithur, Minister for Gender, Children and Social Protection, and will include three Members of Parliament, one of whom is also a Deputy Minister of State, a Deputy Commissioner of the National Independent Human Rights Commission, known as the Commission on Human Rights and Administrative Justice (CHRAJ), and officials from government agencies responsible for health, food and agriculture, education, foreign affairs, local government as well as representatives of civil society and the media.

Officials of the Ghana Permanent Mission who will also be part of the delegation of Ghana include the Ambassador and Permanent Representative, H.E. Mr. Sammie Eddico, the Deputy Permanent Representative, Mr. Ebenezer Appreku, as well as the Minister-Counsellor/Head of Chancery, Ms. Vivian K. Asempapa and First Secretary Mrs. Laila Heward-Mills.

As indicated in the Annex attached, herewith, the list of the delegation of Ghana will include seven journalists from the print and electronic media representing state-owned and private media houses. The Ghana Permanent Mission would be grateful to know if any special permit will be required to enable the media personnel to use their cameras to cover the session.

The delegation will attend the opening session on 20 October, as well as the consideration of the report submitted by Ghana scheduled for Friday, 24 October 2014. Furthermore, some members of the delegation will be available to attend the informal meeting between the Committee and States parties to be held on 6 November 2014.
