



ATTACHMENT CONCERNING THE DATA PROVIDED BY THE COURT

Criminal proceedings concerning “persecutory acts, acts of violence against women or domestic violence and family abuse” are given - by express order of the Head of the Court - the highest priority by the Judges. The investigations, in any case, must be carried out within the time limits set by Article 6(2) of Law no. 93/2008. Although criminal proceedings pertaining to gender violence are concluded in a very short time, Law no. 60/2025 ("Provisions on the reasonable duration of proceedings and fair compensation") has established the maximum duration for each instance of the proceedings and instruments for expedition of proceedings; if proceedings are concluded with unreasonable delay, the party is entitled to fair compensation.

2023:

25 registered criminal proceedings, of which:

17 were concluded, in particular:

- 13 were dismissed (on average, the dismissal time for these proceedings was about 6/7 months);
- 1 concluded with a criminal conviction decree (adopted within approximately 3 months of registration);
- 3 concluded with a judgement (rendered within one year and six months of registration).

8 are pending, in particular:

- 7 at the hearing stage following indictment (on average within about 10 months);
- 1 at the pre-trial stage.

2024:

38 registered criminal proceedings, of which:

23 were concluded, in particular:

- 20 were dismissed (on average, the dismissal time for these proceedings was about 5/6 months);
- 1 concluded with a criminal conviction decree (adopted within approximately 8 months of registration);
- 2 concluded with a judgement (rendered on average within ten months of registration).

15 are pending, in particular:

- 7 at the hearing stage following indictment (on average within about 5 months);
- 8 at the pre-trial stage.
