



Number of cases filed to the Courts of Domestic Violence 2007-2013






Percentage distribution of care for victims of domestic violence, by gender. 2010-2013


Distribution by age range of cases in which the victim is a woman, 2013









Percentage distribution of women trafficking cases detected in the country, according to the end of trafficking for 2013





National elections 2014-2018




Headings of the payrolls for councils by gender by province.



Presidencies percentage of Indigenous Development Associationsby gender.




Elected women mayors by political party. Elections 2002-2010

Number of elected male and female mayors. Local elections 2002-2010



Percentage of elected named receiverships and substitution by gender.




Percentage composition of the boards of 26 public institutions of the country by gender June 2014








Total births to mothers under age 16, by the age of the mother. 2008-2013


Total births to mothers under 16 years according to the marital status reported by the mother 2008-2013






Number of people with HIV and AIDS, by gender. 2008-2013








