Background



People with disability have the same rights as other people.



The Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities is an international law that protects our rights.



It is called the **CRPD** for short.

Australia has agreed to the CRPD.



Australia is reviewed by the United Nations every 4 years on how we are doing at following the CRPD.

The report focuses on 3 really important areas.



- 1. Making decisions
- 2. Freedom
- 3. Respect

Making decisions



People with disability have the right to make their own decisions.

They have the right to have support to make decisions.



This is called equal recognition before the law.



Some Australian laws say some people with disability do not have the right to make decisions.

For example guardianship laws.



We recommend

Australia brings in a supported decision making law so everyone with disability has the right to make decisions.

Freedom



People with disability have the right to freedom.

This is called the right to liberty and security.


It means people can only be detained or held if there is a good reason.



People with disability in Australia can have their freedom taken away in the criminal justice and mental health systems.



Sometimes people with are held in prison even though they are not guilty of a crime.



We recommend

Australia change the laws so this does not happen.

Respect




People with disability have the right to be respected and not to be mistreated.

This is called integrity of the person.



Some people are given medication or operations to stop them having babies without agreeing to it.



Intersex people are born with physical sexual parts that do not fit with the medical norms of female or male bodies.



Sometimes doctors do operations to change this without consent.

We recommend

Australia change the laws to protect peoples rights.

The Committe on the Rights of Persons with Disability reviews Australia in September 2019.

Recommendation

The Australian Human Rights Commission recommends
The Committee request an update from the Australian
Government on what they have done about these 3
areas in 12 months time.
