Participation of NHRIs

The Committee examines all initial and periodic reports in public meetings, which **NHRIs** representatives can The attend. Committee recognizes the important role that NHRIs play in combating racism and racial discrimination. In its General Recommendation paragraph 2 (a), the Committee recommended that NHRIs assist their respective States to comply with their reporting obligations and closely monitor the follow-up to the

concluding observations and recommendations of the Committee.

Furthermore, according to the Committee's practice, NHRIs accredited with an "A" status by the Global Alliance of National Human Rights Institution (GANHRI), with the consent of the concerned State party, can address the Committee in plenary on issues related to the dialogue between the Committee and a State party, on the first day of the consideration of the report after the statements made by the delegation and the country Rapporteur.

Documentation

The reports of the nine States parties scheduled at the 102nd session, the provisional agenda (CERD/C/102/1) and other documents pertaining to the session will be available soon at our web page. At the 102nd, no reviews of States parties' reports will take place.

Venue

The 102^{nd} session of the Committee will take place Online in **Geneva.**

NHRIs reports

Committee The welcomes written by information submitted **NHRIs** in relation to the implementation of the Convention by States parties whose reports are to be considered. Due to the postponement of the consideration of States parties' reports, submissions from NHRIs for reviews are also postponed. However, submissions under the Early warning and urgent action procedure and under the Follow-up procedure as well as for the adoption of the List of issues prior to reporting on Guyana, are welcome.

List of issues prior to reporting

At the 102nd session, CERD will adopt a list of issues prior to reporting on Guyana, Trinidad & Tobago and Tunisia.

All submissions to CERD should:

1. Be submitted in English, French or Spanish. As most Committee members use English as their preferred working language, documents submitted in French and Spanish should, to the extent possible, be translated into English, an executive summary in English

- 2. Be transmitted to the CERD Secretariat electronically **CERD**@ohchr.org the requests under Early Warning **Urgent Action Procedures** (EWUAP) should be submitted before 26 October 2020. The reports relating to the Followup assessment to concluding observations should submitted by 26 October 2020. Reports for the adoption of the of issues prior reporting Guyana, on Monaco and Tunisia should also be submitted 30 October 2020. CERD will follow-up reports assess received from the following States parties: Cuba, Guatemala. Kyrgyzstan, Montenegro and Republic of Korea.
